## Directions to Windhorse Farm:

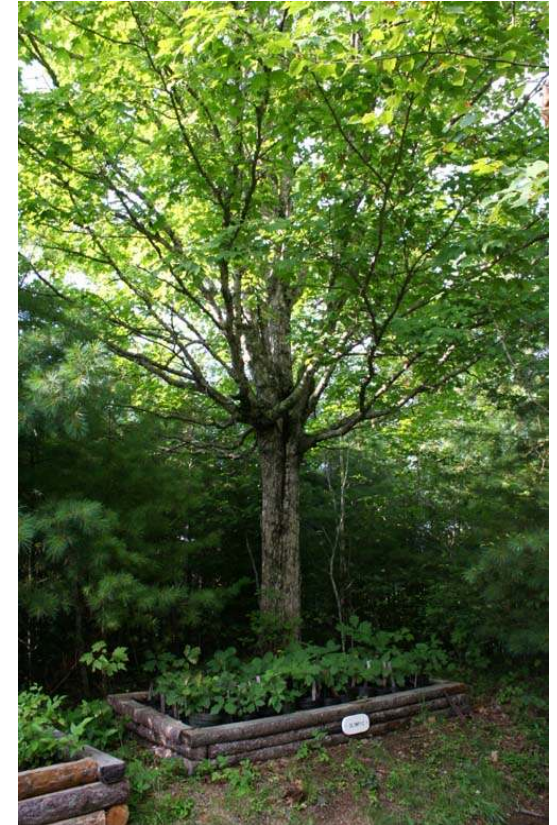
From Bridgewater, go north on Highway 10 (towards New Germany) for 10 km, then turn left on Wentzell Road. Go 1 km and over an iron bridge. Immediately after the bridge, turn right on Sarty Road. Windhorse Farm is the first place on the left (#132).

From Halifax, go west on Hwy 103 to exit 12. Turn right on Highway 10 and follow the directions above.
