1. Balsam Fir (<i>Abies balsamea</i>) - aromatic quick growing evergreen that can be planted both in full sun or partial shade. Tips often used for wreaths and garlands. Oils used for healing balms.	N	Yes
2. Red Spruce (<i>Picea rubens</i>) - long lived spruce and main indicator species in the Acadian Forest, prized for instrument making and grows in partial shade. Great species for adding diversity and for restoration.	N	Yes
3. White Pine (<i>Pinus strobus</i>) - sun loving native pine tree that used to dominate our local forests. Grows quickly and has beautiful gentle needles.	N	Yes
4. Eastern Hemlock (<i>Tsuga canadensis</i>) - long lived evergreen with delicate needles and beautiful shape for planting in partial shade. Great species for adding diversity and for restoration.	N	Yes

3. Red Maple (<i>Acer rubra</i>) - versatile native maple with beautiful red twigs and small red flowers in the spring. Grows either in full sun or partial shade.	N	Yes
3. Sugar Maple (<i>Acer saccharum</i>) - this is the prized maple syrup tree as well as a lovely hardwood with beautiful orange fall foliage. Grows best in partial shade.	N	Yes
1. Horse-chestnut (<i>Aesculus hippocastamus</i>) - Sun-loving beautiful tree with large distinctive palmate leaves. Produces large chestnuts enjoyed by wildlife. Although not native to the Acadian forest, it has long been cultivated for generations in Lunenburg County.	H	No
2. Yellow Birch (<i>Betula alleghaniensis</i>) - beautiful member of the birch family with silvery-gold bark as it ages. Young twigs and sap have a mild wintergreen flavour.	N	Yes
3. Hazelnut (<i>Corylus cornuta</i>) - small shrub-like tree that produces edible hazelnuts in the fall. Great for wildlife and adding diversity to open areas.	N	No
3. Oak Red (<i>Quercus rubra</i>) - versatile native maple with beautiful red twigs and small red flowers in the spring. Grows either in full sun or partial shade.	N	No
3. Willow Gold (<i>Salix spp.</i>) - beautiful bright yellow branches that adds colour to the end of winter and early spring landscape. Long whips can be harvested each year for decorative twig bouquets, basket-making, spring wreaths or living fences.	WHF	Whips available in spring

1. Red Osier Dogwood (<i>Cornus sericea</i>) - beautiful red twigs in the winter, deep green foliage and white flowers in the summer. Grows well in wet open areas as well as in drier sites.	N	No
2. Forsythia (<i>Forsythia spp.</i>) - Early blooming yellow flowers gives a colourful backdrop for any garden in the spring. This is a heritage flowering shrub well-loved in Lunenburg County.	H	No
3. Annabelle Hydrangea (<i>Hydrangea arborescens</i>) - large, rounded creamy white flower clusters that make a statement in any garden. Dry flowers can be used for decoration in winter.	WHF	No
